It's important for children to be involved in both direct and indirect caring.

The Central Bucks Community of Concern was created as a partnership between CB Cares Educational Foundation and the Central Bucks School District school nurses, in an effort to keep the youth of the District free of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs. Funding for the publication of the booklet was provided by a \$4,000 grant from the Village Improvement Association's Community Response Fund.
